



* The Life and Crimes of Hoodie Rosen by Isaac Blum

Yehuda "Hoodie" Rosen is part of an Orthodox Jewish community that has just relocated from Colwyn to (fictional) Tregaron, Pennsylvania. Hoodie faithfully observes the Jewish laws that govern his community, but things get complicated when he meets Anna-Marie. Spending time with a gentile girl is strictly forbidden, but when they discover antisemitic graffiti in a local graveyard they spontaneously work together to clean up the headstones. His rabbi catches him in the act, and Hoodie becomes an exile within his school and even his family. Everything is complicated by the fact that Anna-Marie's mother – who is the mayor of Tregaron – opposes the expansion of Hoodie's Orthodox community. When a series of violent hate crimes ratchets up the stakes, Hoodie finds himself questioning the rules he has always lived by. This timely, heartfelt debut novel is a perfect choice for fans of Jared Reck's *Donuts and Other Proclamations of Love*.
