(thank you) and sing to the berries so the land knows they are grateful (and so the bears know they are near) and the land sings back to them. Back at home, the family makes syrup, marmalades, jams and jellies, pie, and scones to share. How many different berries does the pair find? Can you taste the sweet and colorful jewels? Be sure to notice all of the animals they meet along their journeys. The author reminds us to be careful when picking wild foods and to only take what we need in order to share with others and with animals.

Althea Gibson: The Story of Tennis' Fleet-of-Foot Girl by Megan Reid; illustrated by Laura Freeman (RL: 3.6)

This is the true story of Althea Gibson, the first black Wimbledon, French, and U.S. Open tennis champion. You will also learn that Althea Gibson broke barriers in the tennis world and became a champion on and off the court with her grit, determination, and bravery.
